


Meet up at 11:30 a.m. at **13th and Locust Streets** in Center City Philadelphia on Sunday morning, board the trolley and enjoy the parade. PFP is in spot #4 in the parade on Locust Street which will step off promptly at noon. Wear your PFP shirts to show your family pride!

The trolley will let passengers off at Penn's Landing for the **Pride Festival** at the end of the parade at approximately 1:00 p.m. If you'd prefer, you can catch a ride back to Center City on the trolley.

PFP supports Earned Sick Days Bill

In May, Philadelphia Family Pride became one of



over 100 local organizations to join the Coalition for Healthy Families and Workplaces to support a bill currently moving through Philadelphia City Council that would ensure that full and part time workers in the city can earn paid time off when they or a loved one is sick.



Promoting Healthy Families and Workplaces Act (Bill 080474) would allow Philadelphia workers the opportunity to earn up to 7 days of sick time per year for a large business and up to 4 days per year for a small business. It was voted out of the Public Health and Human Services Committee earlier this year. The bill could affect up to 200,000 workers in Philadelphia who do not have access to paid sick days.

The earned sick days bill is LGBT-inclusive: it explicitly allows workers to use earned sick time to care for spouses, domestic partners or life partners, parents, grandparents, siblings, biological children, grandchildren, foster children, adopted children, stepchildren, legal wards, and children of workers who stand "in loco parentis." This phrase covers LGBT parents who do not have a legal or biological relationship to their children.

PFP Community Coordinator Stephanie Haynes spoke at a press conference at the William Way Center on June 8 with other LGBT leaders and AIDS/HIV activists on the importance of this measure to the LGBT community. (Pictured, far left holding her son.)

"No one wants to send a contagious child to school or go to work when they are sick, but the lack of paid sick days leave some parents no choice. Parents should not have to choose between a days pay and taking their sick child to the doctor," Ms. Haynes commented.

PFP Education Committee Chair Marla McCulloch is scheduled to testify for the bill at a City Council hearing on June 9. The final vote is expected on June 16.
